Dr. Shuhaiber is a respected physician at the University of Florida Department of Neurology and General Neurology Division. He completed his Adult Neurology residency at NYU- Langone Medical Center and Bellevue Hospital in New York City, then completed his Child Neurology fellowship at Boston University Medical Center in Boston, MA, followed by his fellowship in Clinical Medical Genetics at New York-Presbyterian Hospital/Columbia University Medical Center.

In addition to being a member of the Alachua County Medical Society, Dr. Shuhaiber is also a member of the American Academy of Neurology, American Society of Human Genetics, National Society of Genetic Counselors and the Neuro-oncology Society.

Among the awards he's earned are the N. Paul Rosman, M.D. Excellence In Teaching award from Boston University (2013) and American Academy of Neurology Resident Scholarship Travel award (2013).

His research interests include Neurocutaneous syndromes, pediatric to adult transition care and General Neurology. Among his clinical interests

are General Neurology, Neuro-genetics disease counseling and Genetics of Huntington disease, just to name a few. His teaching interests include Neurology clerkship group facilitator, Resident physician's bedside and didactic teaching and Lecturer for resident physician education. He is fluent in English, French and Spanish and was a Clinical Assistant Professor of Neurology at New York Medical College, Valhalla, New York.
